etc., etc., working under rules and regulations as outlined hereafter, under the heading "Sub-Councils, Composition and Rules". The activities of the International Court and its sub-councils shall be purely international. Under no circumstances would the organization interfere in any internal national affairs of any country in any manner, except where such national affairs might hold a potential threat (such as excessive armaments and/or other preparations for aggression) to the security of other nations and world peace. It will be found that in outlining these Basic Plans no attempt is made to go into details or figures. This is deliberate, for the simple reason that if we intend to make a new beginning, then we must start on virgin ground and these plans are but intended as the seeds from which to grow a new and better crop of conditions for all nations and It will be the manner and care with which we peoples. tend the growth of this new crop that will determine its ultimate value. Too much detail in the pioneering stages would hinder development and might cloud the issue. It is obvious that a maze of detail must inevitably be encountered in the development of such a vast problem as the post-war re-organization of world affairs in the interests of humanity. To accomplish successfully this great task we must start to re-build with plain and simple basic ideas, never forgetting nor reglecting the primary object at which we are aiming :-
