

The letters which relate to this feature of the classification and their meaning are as follows:

- A represents—Agent, Salesman or Merchant.
- E “ —Chemical or Metallurgical Engineer.
- C “ —Consultant Chemist or Analyst.
- M “ —Chemical Manufacturer.
- O “ —Official (Government), (Customs, etc.).
- P “ —Professor, or Lecturer, or Demonstrator.
- W “ —Works Chemist or Works Manager.
- X “ —Any other profession or occupation n.e.s.

Inasmuch as a name may appear under several headings of the classification, therefore the names have also been arranged alphabetically in index form, which will be found at the latter part of the pamphlet, to facilitate reference to the classifications.

At this time when the resources of the country, both in men and material, are most urgently needed by the Empire, and when so much of the success in the use of our material resources is dependent upon technical knowledge and special training, it is hoped that this list will serve a useful purpose in tending to promote a close relationship between the Investor and the Chemist.
