Y. That all monies contributed by individuals for membership, of for the general purposes of the Convention, shall be appropriwidd, after the payment of incidental expenses, as the Convention sall direct, unless otherwise ordered by the donors.
VI. That the Board of Directors shall be empowered to meet parterly or oftener for the despatch of business, at such place as the Convention shall from time to time appoint ; nine members dill form a quorum. The Board shall also be empowered to vorvene special meetings of the Convention, whenever the same ny be judged necessary by a majority of its memters.
VII. That the Convention shall meet on the first Saturday after be 18th day of August, annually, at sach place as shall be agreed a by the Borly: when, in addition to the appoinment of the Ofice-bearers and Board of Directors, and the transaction of such winess as may be biought before the meeting in accordance with Aricle 2 of this Constitution, a Missionary Board or Boards shall echosen, each consisting of fifteen members of the Convention, 2 of whom shall be members of Baptist Churches, in regular tanding. These Boards shall hold their meetings at such places she Convention shall annually appoint ; at least one-third of bembers of each Board shall reside in the place of meeting, tin its vicinity ; and five shall constitute a quorum.
The Convention shall also appoint, once in three years, six wernors of Acadia College, in place of six who will then go Itill rotation, in accordance with the resolution passed by this Ovention at its annual mecting in September, 1850, and in xordance with the Act 14 Vic. of the Legislature of Nova Wia: Chap. 37.
VIII. That this Constitution may be altered or amended at any arual Meeting of the Convention, by two-thirds of the members tent.
