HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, ex-cepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the dis-trict in which the lands situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, dauchter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead conditions under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months' resi-dence unon and culturation of the land in each year for three years.

(3)—If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered force may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his per-manent residence upon farming load owned by him in the viden-ity of his homestead, the require-ments as to residence may he sat-isfied by residence upon the said land. land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commis-sioner of Pominion Lands at Ot-tawa of intention to apply for patent.
