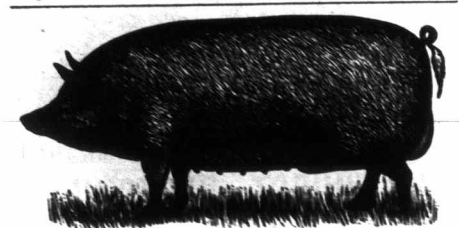

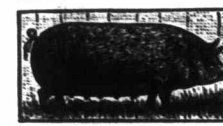

GOSSIP.

In writing to advertisers, mention the "Farmer's Advocate."

On the 1st of July, Messrs. Alfred Mansell & Co., Shrewsbury, acting as agents for Messrs. D. G. Hammer & Sons, Ontario, shipped per the steamship Mount Royal, from the Millwall dock, London, one of the most choice consignments of sheep that have left England this season, including in all 106 sheep of various British breeds. The consignment comprised some valuable specimens of Shropshire sheep, including several prizewinners at the Royal and other shows, from the noted flocks of Messrs. R. P. Cooper, A. Tanner, A. E. Mansell, W. Thomas, T. S. Minton, S. F. M. Nevett, J. Harding, J. S. Harding, and R. Bach. Oxfordshire were represented by selections from such celebrated flocks as Mr. Albert Brassey, M. P., Mr. J. T. Hobbs, Mr. W. J. P. Reading, Mr. H. W. Stigoe, Mr. W. Arkell. The Southdowns contained some nice sheep from Mr. Ashley D. Potter and Mr. George Jonas. Some Dorsets from Mr. W. R. Flower, and some Cotswolds from Mr. W. T. Garne and Mr. W. Thomas were also included in the shipment.

Mr. W. T. Miller, Carlos City, Indiana, recently visited Canada and made the following purchases of Shorthorns: From Mr. Platt, of Hamilton, imp. Cecil, by Clan Alpine (60469), bred by A. Cruickshank, and her bull calf; also Luster 18th, by Captain Ripley (63433), bred by W. S. Marr. From the herd of James I. Davidson & Son, Balsam: Naomi 2nd, by Duke of Sonja, whose sire was imp. Premier Earl (48454); also her bull calf Commander, by Village Boy 9th 130667; The Queen, by Duke of Sonja, and her heifer calf Queen of Diamonds, by Sittytown Hero 130633; Village Girl, by Village Boy 9th, and her heifer calf Village Girl 8th, by Sittytown Hero; and Village Girl 3rd, an extra good two-year-old heifer by Village Boy 9th. All these have a Golden Drop foundation, tracing to Bloom by Moss Trooper (11827), the property of Mr. Cruickshank; on the top of this Diphthong (17681), Broadbalt 129268 (28073), and Royal Bampton (32996). These three bulls were bred by Mr. A. Cruickshank. He also purchased from Messrs. Davidson, Necklace 23rd, by Scottish Prince 121084, whose dam was the same as that of Mr. Barber's Necklace 20th, which has been so successful in the showing; also 55th Duchess of Gloster, dam 1st Duchess of Gloster, by (imported and exported) Hospodar.

H. GEE & SON'S SHORTHORNS, SHROPSHIRE, AND BARRED PLYMOUTH ROCKS.

When we called upon Mr. H. Gee & Son, near Fisherville, Ont., we found them busily engaged among some splendid grain crops, especially fall wheat. In looking over the herd and flocks we saw a promising young Shorthorn bull (in field condition), which will readily attract the attention of buyers as soon as the seasonable period arrives, and as he possesses a good amount of beefing qualities, he is the sort much sought.

The Shropshires this year are being brought out in rather better form. The ewes are bred from Campbell, Cooper and Phin foundation stock, and are a well-covered, strong, uniform bunch, possessing an abundance of superb quality, and to which was mated last season the strong-bone, rangy young ram, Jupiter 7106, by Ontario, from the flock of Mr. George Raikes, which has made an unmistakable impression. A few ram lambs will be offered this fall which are fit to head pure-bred flocks, possessing quantity and quality in fleece and good breed form.

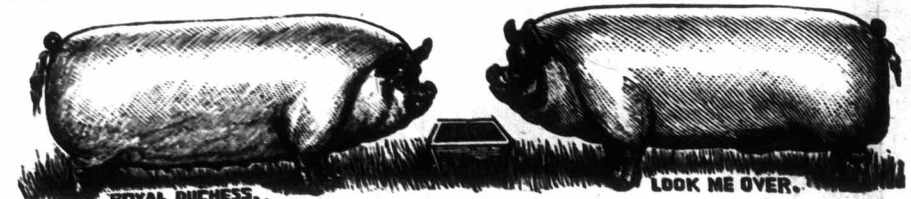
In the B. P. Rock pens the visitor finds his entertainment. Mr. Gee, Jr., being an enthusiastic fancier of that worthy strain, consequently he has gone to almost endless trouble and expense in obtaining the best. Importations have recently been made from such breeders of note as Mr. Geo. M. Lefel and Mr. Sid Conger, the former having the most renowned reputation in this breed in the United States. The firm found an extremely active demand for young stock last season, and sold out pretty closely, but will be well prepared for a rush this season with some exceptionally choice young things. In Mr. Gee's pens we saw the strongest, most uniform and uniformly marked lot of hens we ever remember seeing together, and as the proprietor has studied the business in detail and is desirous of being at the top, we would consider him a safe man from whom to purchase. R. JEFFS & SON'S SHORTHORNS, SOUTH DOWNS, LEICESTERS, AND BERKSHIRES.

The same enthusiasm was found to exist in the interest of Messrs. E. Jeffs & Sons' farms, at Bonhead, Ont., upon our visit early in July as marked our former visits to the farms. The firm have given much attention to the Margarets, by Snowball, and Zora families of Shorthorns, and each succeeding crop of calves confirms their belief as to the usefulness of those strains. From the former, sensational showyard performers have arisen, the noted Cambridge Lass, of Omaha fame, being a descendant, while much other creditable stuff has been produced at home. The Maid of Honor family is also represented, and we were shown some choice calves, of either sex, tracing to these foundations and the services of the Russell-bred bull, Prince Arthur 23377, by Prince Royal 14836, and out of Miss Ramsden, by Chancellor, and running to Centennial winners. The seven young bulls are showing the result of the attention they are receiving. They possess the early-maturing qualities of their ancestors and inherit their red and roan colors. A yearling grandson of imp. Guardsman, that was growing rapidly, was also on hand at the time of our visit.

In Berkshires the firm are, as usual, well supplied. Half a dozen brood sows are constantly kept on hand. The sire now in service, though of Teasdale breeding, was purchased from Messrs. W. and J. Russell, Richmond Hill, Ont. A large number of young things, two months and under, were on hand when we called.

The Southdowns and Leicesters are still receiving their share of attention, and none but well selected and matured breeding stock is added to their pen. In Southdowns some half dozen strong-cheating rams were on hand, descendants of Marsh and Jackson foundation stock. Leicesters have lately been added, and the stock the firm have so far obtained have so favorably impressed them with the breed as to warrant their reaching out in this direction.
