The greater part of the butter used in the cities of Brazil is said to be imported from France, Germany and Ireland, principally from the latter market. The native butter of Brazil is of an inferior quality, and their dairying is of the most primitive and unsatisfactory character, yielding a product of a very inferior kind. very inferior kind.

Pork in October was worth \$15 in Chicago, and now it is only worth \$10.70. Indications are that the crop of Western hogs for packing will be largely in excess of last season.

Canada is doing an immense business in shipping lobsters to England. Last week one ship took from Halifax \$83,000 worth in cans for London, which represents something like 655,000 lobsters, and a few days before a shipment worth \$72,000 was made. \$72,000 was made.

The culture of coffee in Callfornia is becoming profitable. The plant grows as vigorously as in the coffee countries of South America, and yields a bean of strong aromatic flavor. Central and Southern California are the regions peculiarly favorable.

Square Cheese.

We have wondered, and it seems somebody else has wondered too, why cheeses should always be made round. We have seen a square cheese, one foot long and four inches high and wide, weighing ten pounds. This is just the cheese for family use. It weighs just about enough, and the consumer can begin at one end and cut off a slice as thick as required. No fresh surface is exposed except the end where the cutting has begun, and this can easily be covered so that flies cannot get at it, and meanwhile the cheese will not dry up.—Rurat-New Yorker. get at it, and New Yorker.
