A Bill, entitled, An Act to continue the Act relating to Passengers from Great-Britain and Ireland, arriving in this Province. **Passengers Bill**

A Bill, entitled, An Act concerning the Circuit Courts in this Province. **Circuit Courts Bill**

A Bill, entitled, An Act concerning the Barristers and Attornies practising in the Courts of this Province. **Barristers Bill**
