TRIAL OF HUN DYNAMITERS

Is Continued in San Francisco This Week—Nearing an End

By Courier Leased Wire.
San Francisco, Jan. 2.—The fifth week of the trial of Franz Dupp, German consul-general here and six associates on charges of conspiring to violate neutrality by alleged dynamiting of Canadian tunnels and munition ships destined for Great Britain and her allies, was begun in federal district court to-day. Both sides agreed to make every effort to complete the presentation of evidence in order that the case may reach the jury by Friday night. The cross-examination of C. C. Crowley, a detective employed by the German consulate for the announced purpose of investigating alleged neutrality violations is to be resumed by District Attorney Preston Crowley, according to government prosecutors, planned the various dynamite plots at the behest of the San Francisco German consular officials. Crowley was under cross-examination all day Friday, when adjournment was taken over the holidays.
Preston has attempted to show that Crowley and Louis J. Smith, one of the defendants, who has since become a government witness, worked together in various cities of the United States and Canada for the purpose of hampering war shipments.

News Notes

The number of soldiers returned to Canada as medically unfit has increased from 3,000 to 8,600 in a year.
Calcutt's Brewery, established in 1855, has closed down at Peterboro, owing to the Ontario Temperance Act.

While at Newmarket for Christmas, Mrs. John Galbraith of Weyburn, Sask., died suddenly at the home of her son.

A complimentary banquet was held at Peterboro in honor of Mr. Dan O'Connell, barrister, who is leaving to practice law in Toronto.
Within a few minutes two men were killed by engines in the Algoma steel plant yard at Sault Ste. Marie, Geo. C. Cunyoun and Robert Bell.

The Quinte Boys' Conference is in full swing at Lindsay. About thirty ministers are in attendance and two hundred young men and older boys.
Dr. Frank D. Adams of the University of Montreal was chosen president of the Geological Society of America at the annual meeting held in Albany, N.Y.

At a meeting of the Woodstock Board of Education the resignation of Principal Levan was accepted and W. J. Satter of the Collegiate Staff was appointed.
It is twenty-seven years since a pool was required for the separate school board in Stratford.

Chief of Police Bickley, of Woodstock, has resigned, following a charge of being incapable while on duty preferred by Market Clerk Stewart.

James Street Baptist Sunday School, Hamilton, made a special contribution of \$1,100 for the erection of a boys' boarding school at Vuyuru, India.

Two hundred delegates from Saskatchewan and Alberta are attending the organizing convention of Rutherfordian Presbyterians, which is being held in Saskatoon.
