## MURDER MYSTERY STILL UNSOLVED

Letter to Hamilton Police Threatening More Killings

Hamilton, March 14—The receipt by the police of an anonymous letter, written in illiterate Bulgarian, and almost illegible, in which the writer states that he is the murderer of Thomas Georgieff, and that there will be more murders, "has given them something to conjecture about. They are inclined to believe that the letter is something in the nature of a 'red herring' drawn across the trail, but are making efforts to ascertain the name of the writer. The finding of a pair of blood-stained overalls about two miles from the scene of the finding of the body of Georgieff, is another matter that is engaging their attention. It is thought these might have been worn by the murdered man and were carried away by his murderer, but they have not been identified yet. No trace has been found of the head, which was severed from the body. The statement that the victim was suffering from a venereal disease, and that this might have proved a motive for the crime, is denied by the doctors who have made a post-mortem examination of the body.
