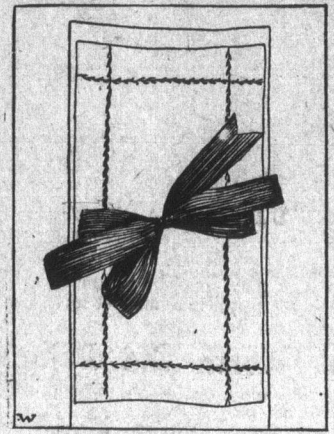

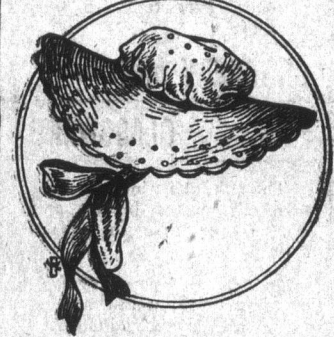
The cover of the bottle is made of light blue elderdown flannel, but any

attractive woolen goods will do as well. The prime requisite of this cover is that it must be considerably larger than the bottle, so that the latter can be easily slipped into it. The edge may be overcast or bound with some pretty wash ribbon that matches the material. The bag should never be more than half full of water, the heat of which is better retained by means of this soft cover than by the towel ordinarily used to wrap it in.

When Buying Bananas.
When you are buying bananas, never purchase the long, thin ones unless you want fruit which will pucker your mouth. No matter how well ripened these thin bananas are, they will always be found both sour and acid. That is because the bunch containing them was picked too soon. The banana grows fastest at first in length. When it has reached its fullest development in that direction, it suddenly begins to swell and in a few days will double its girth.

At the same time very rotund bananas should be avoided, for many knowing vendors can produce this effect on the fruit by artificial means.

Colored Slips Under Lawn Dresses. Rickrack Again Used.

The custom of wearing a slip underneath thin dresses has made it possible to wear them in winter and summer. And the new spring styles show these thin gowns over washable lawns in white, pink, buff and blue, and they also show them over taffeta foundations.

Odd effects in lawns and muslins are obtained by printed figures, which give the impression of eyelet embroidery designs, showing a contrasting color below the openwork.

It may be that the days of rickrack are returning, for one sees dresses trimmed with braid made into lace with such a fine design that very little of the actual braid is recognizable. For instance, there are braids that are twisted and turned and made up with

Fine straw hats with wings and rosettes of straw are among the novelties seen in the shops.

Morning gowns that are made with breakfast jackets and skirts to match are both dainty and comfortable. Here is one made of dotted calico and trimmed with lace. Dotted swiss carried out in the same design would be charming for a summer morning gown.

novelties of the season. These pastel laces are often used with black velvet ribbon or black lace.

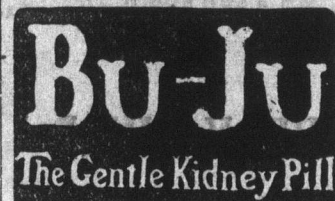

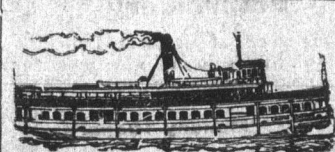

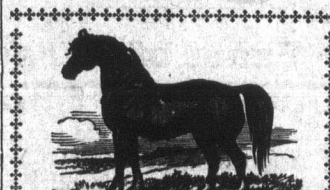
