LONGSHOREMEN

Men Go Back to Work at Old Wages of Thirty Cents an Hour-Leader Broke Down and Wept Bitterly-Cheered by His Followers-Loss In Wages Has Been About a Million

New York, June 15.—There was a pathetic scene at the meeting of the longshoremen, whose strike for in-

longshoremen, whose strike for increased pay was declared off. Patrick Comnors, leader of the strikers, broke down and wept when compelled to make the acknowledgment that the men were beaten.

There was a moment's silence, and then the hall rang with cheers for the leader, while many of the men who had faced privation in the effort to win their demands hurried to the platform, shook Connors by the hand, and assured him that he had made a good fight. More than 12,000 of the original 20,000 strikers who remained firm will return to work to-day.

The strike has lasted nearly six weeks, and was a great financial loss to the steamship companies and to the workers. The loss in wages to the longshoremen has been close to a million dollars.

Ottawa, June 15.—There is going to be a hot contest for the Liberal nomination in Ottawa for the Dominion House. It is understood that the French sitting member, the Hon. N. A. Belcourt, whose health is far from satisfactory, will seek refuge in the Senate, and the struggle for the nomination will lie between August Lemieux, a brother of the Postmaster-General, and Emmanuel Tasse.

The former is a young man of undoubted ability, while the latter has not always been a straight Liberal. His chief claim to notice is his connection with the Capital Lacrosse Club. He is very popular.

Out on Suspended Sentence. Belleville, June 15.—Tracy Belch of this city, who a week ago was found guilty of receiving goods stolen by his brothers from a G. T. R. freight car, was brought up for sentence, and Judge Deroche let him go on suspend-ed sentence.

BECKONS THE WORLD.

presentatives ary Nation Gather At The Hague Conference. Representative The Hague, June 15.—This city sud-lenly blossomed out with flags yes-erday morning, representatives of denly blossomed out with flags yesterday morning, representatives of every civilized country on the globe hoisting its standard over the globe and legations clustered about the two principal squares, while the hotels facing the sea at Scheveningen, with their multi-colored banners snapping in a stiff breeze, formed a stirring picture.

A Camp of Nations.

A Camp of Nations.

It was like a vast camp of the nations of the world. The weather could not have been finer, cool with bright sunshine.

sunshine.

Practically all the missing delegations arrived during the day for the conference, which begins to-day. The English, twenty-five strong, headed by Sir Edward Frye, judge of the Chancery division of the British High Court of Justice, and member of the permanent court of arbitration at The Hague, reached here early by way of Hook of Holland.

Several Grave Questions.

Several Grave Questions. There are grave questions to be settled at the forthcoming conference. Both Japan and Russia were guilty of laying mines in neutral waters during their war. This must be dealt with. So must Russia's proclamation making coal, provisions and railroad making coal, provisions and railroad material contraband of war if bound for a Chinese or Japanese port, even if not destined for the Japanese army

for a Chinese or Japanese port, even if not destined for the Japanese army or navy.

Then there is the issue as to the right of a belligerent fleet to coal and effect repairs in neutral ports, claimed by Russia for her ill-fated Baltic Armada on its way out from Kronstadt to annihilation in the China seas; the right of a belligerent to convert at sea a merchant vessel into a man of war, and to commission her as such, demanded by Russia for her converted cruisers, the St. Petersburg, etc., and the pretensions put forward by the Japanese of right to attack a belligerent vessel in the port of a neutral power too weak to enforce the laws of neutrality. Japan, it may be remembered, sank the Russian cruiser Varig in the Corean port of Chemulpe, and seized the disarmed Russian destroyer Rhyeshitelni, in the Chinese port of Chee-Foo.

Controversy Over Morocco.

There are matters dealing with the care of prisoners of war, the right of Turkey to close the Dardanelles to the warships of Russia, the desire of Emperor William to submit his controversy with France on the subject of Morocco to the tribunal and the need of action to bring order out of the chaotic conditions now existing in Crete.
