

Canadian Prices

A remarkable similarity in the cost of groceries in England and in Canada is revealed in a com-A soap manufacturer was once parison of a budget of household staples in the two countries made vertising altogether and did not within the last three weeks. The figures are given out by a Canadian n London, England.

Bread is 4 cents higher in Canda; sugar is 10 cents per pound higher and jam and marmalaed ranges from 10 cents to 18 cents higher here. But in England, bacon, eggs, lard, milk, sausages, Worcester sauce, rice, oranges and dried fruits are all higher in price. Eggs were \$1 a dozen, and butter about \$1.10 a pound for good grade. Both these prices are due for a sharp decrease in London, however. Vegetables are still much cheaper in England than in Canada, and butcher meats average from thirty to forty cents a pound. Coal is about \$1.25 per
