Recipes.

Cream Cake—One half cup of sweet cream, one cup of sugar, three eggs, one cup of flour, one teaspoonful of baking powder. Put the ingredients together in the order named, beat thoroughly, and bake in jelly tins. Spread between the cakes after baking a filling made of one half cup of very thick sweet cream into which has been stirred one cup of powdered sugar. Flavor cake and filling with a little vanilla.
