Fifty tubs of butter were brought to the city Saturday by the Jacques Carlier from the Tryon country.

General Elkin Park Soommon, for several years United States Consul at Charlottetown, died at New York, a few days ago.

Advices of the 7th, from Winnipeg, say that overcoats had been discarded in that city, the weather continuing quite mild and summer-like.

The shipping of heavy seas by the steamer Remus during her passage to Philadelphia from Hamburg, practically ruined the entire cargo, valued at \$100,000.

The barn of Mrs. Lawton, near St. John's, N. B., was destroyed by fire on Wednesday night last. Mrs. Lawton's son, aged twenty, was sitting in the barn when the fire broke out. The straw was soon in a blaze. Lawton was unable to save his property, and the stock and himself perished from suffocation.

JAMES SPENCER, aged 77, a resident of West Harbour, Pictou County, N. S., was drowned at that place on Thursday last. He was alone endeavoring to get his boat ashore through the ice which formed near the beach and must have fallen overboard. An aged Indian heard his cries and was too infirm to rescue him.

As old resident of Black River, Kent County, N. B., named Robert Godfrey died very suddenly on the road from his home recently. He was going to town, as was his custom each week, and about six miles from Chatham he got out of his wagon for some purpose and in attempting to take his seat again he fell back dead. Heart disease was the cause.

Thomas A. Gosselin, a Franciscan priest living at Katesville, Cal., has received a letter concerning his brother, who is a missionary in China, and has been stationed in the province of Szechwan. The correspondent states that Father Gosselin was dragged by the hair for two miles and tortured by a mob, who, in his body with knives and spears, killed him. The mandarin in charge of the province, convinced with the persecutors because the priest would not acknowledge the mandarin's authority as supreme.

The Commercial Bank and the Union Bank of St. John's Newfoundland, suspended two or three days ago, and their suspensions created a panic in business circles, causing the failure of several leading mercantile houses. During the past two years, since the day there has been quite a boom in St. John's. Large amounts of money had come in from insurance companies and other sources. The city was rebuilding and wages were high, and things generally were booming. Now, however, what is over, and all is changed. About six thousand idle men are walking the streets without work or money, many of them without food or much hope of getting it for the winter. What the result of the crash will be it is difficult to conjecture.

C., in the issue of the 28th October, contains the following: "A number of Westminster's best citizens have joined the ever-increasing army of benevolent.
