THRESHING THE CROSS.—The Eagle threshers, under the command of Capt. Geo. Burrows, have been in this neighborhood for several days, winding up the threshing here. Fall wheat has turned out a big yield, running about 40 bushels to the acre. The low price, however, has not been reliable. Peas have yielded 30 bushels; spring wheat 16 bushels; oats 32 bushels, very light in weight; barley poor 15 to 20 bushels. The farmers have had a heavy summer's work, from the small boy to the old man, even the ladies have taken their places in the field binding, and at times driving the reaper with the skill of a Dr. The biggest record by the Eagle in threshing this season was on the farm of Mr. Jas. Quaid, near Port Albert. 385 bushels of fall wheat in four hours and a quarter. They have been on their route since the 12th of August, and in all that time lost but half a day, and that was owing to a heavy rain. They have five weeks' work ahead of their yet.
