The great natural strongholds of the Slievean-Ieran chain, and especially that wild, secluded and almost unknown glem, call-ed "The Glan," about 8 miles long and from 3 to 12 miles across form-ed the cradle and the refuge of their

ace-too poor to covet and too difficult o conquer. They have produced many able men as rulers in the Roman Oatho-lic Church, in literature and in war. They have been called the MacGauran aince the introduction of surnames in Ireland—a century earlier than in Eng-land—from Gauran, a hero of the famland-from Gauran, a hero of the fam-ily. Before that they were known as the Tullyhaw, or the descendents of Eohey. The place teok name from the people here, as was the Irish custom, and the immense barony of Tullyhaw, in Western Cavan, still transmits their tribal name, and formed but a portion of tribal name, and formed but a portion of the patrimonial possessions of Echey Eeelyah, the progenitor, who obtained Ard Ri-ship of Erin, fifty years before the Christian era. This Echey forms a very important figure in Irish history, as he brought back the Monarchy ef Erin to the race of Heremon after they had lost it for 90 years. Almost all the succeeding monarchs of Ireland from that time until they ceased to have monarchs, were descended from him as Conn of the Hundred Fights, Cormac MacArt, Echey Moyvane and Nial the

MacArt, Eohey Moyvane and Nial the Great, from whom are descended almost all the principal families of the north of Ireland and Scotland, and from whom Queen Victoria descends through the Stewarts. The Magaurans keep up the memory of their origin by electing a "King of the Glan," from the noblest "Aning of the Gian," from the noblest families of the race, who, until very lately, used to adjust all quarrels and disputes, and whose award was scarcely ever called in guestion. The cure of hy-drophobia is a secret in one family of the Magauran tribe. Now if these historical facts are true, and as one who understands fusion in the scale of the second sec Irish history tolerably well, I challenge contradiction, there seems to me to be quite enough, apart from the lovely and romantic scenery, to make the people themselves an interesting study.
