Cloud Burst Overwhelms City.

Two Million Dollar Loss at Scranton, Pa.—No German Wares For France—Irish Republicans Growing Angry—Belfast's Week End Tragedies.

DAMAGE FROM CLOUD BURST.

SCRANTON, June 18. Damage as the result of a cloud-burst here last night is estimated at two million dollars.

WILL NOT PARTICIPATE.

PARIS, June 18. The French Government announced on Saturday that French citizens would not take advantage of the agreement reached by the Reparations Commission whereby citizens of the Allies may place orders direct from German manufacturers. France desires to operate under the Wiesbaden Convention which gives her certain priorities.

REPUBLICAN ANGER RISING.

LONDON, June 18. De Valera has cancelled his proposed tour of Scotland because it is said a Council of Republicans has been called to decide on a course of action. Republican anger against the Irish Constitution is rising, it is reported.

REPUBLICANS SUFFERED LOSSES.

DUBLIN, June 18. Complete returns of the Irish elections are not expected before next Tuesday night. Meanwhile observers corroborate the forecast that notwithstanding the pact between De Valera and Collins forces resulting in the nomination of the panel agreed on candidates of the Republicans will suffer losses. The chief indications were furnished by the vote of the National University of Dublin, where voting papers were seized by Rory O'Connor, Chief of Irregular Republican forces, but not before the decision had been announced that Professor McGinnis, an active supporter of the treaty, was elected in place of Dr. Ada English, Republican. The object of the seizure of the voting papers, it was explained to-day, was to discover how the University electors had voted and whether all the Sinn Feiners among them had observed the De Valera-Collins pact. The electors in this constituency sign their names to the ballot contrary to the practice elsewhere. Only three disturbances were reported during the voting.

THE RESULTS IN CORK.

CORK, June 18. The members of the new Dail Bireann elected by Cork, according to the latest count, are Robert Day, Laborite; Miss Mary MacSwiney, anti-Treaty; J. J. Walsh, pro-Treaty;

PART OF THE PRICE OF INDEPENDENCE.

LONDON, June 18. The British Government has informed the Egyptian Government that the preferential treatment heretofore accorded Egyptian products passing the British customs has been abolished in consequence of Egypt's new status, according to a cable from Reuters' Cairo correspondent.

BELFAST'S TRAGEDIES.

BELFAST, June 18. Four men and one woman were shot dead and two men were wounded this morning near Beas Brook, County Armagh's model village, and the houses of three loyalists were burned. The affair is thought to be in reprisal for the shooting of two men on Wednesday. Other attempts were made to burn houses and a man and his son and another boy and girl were wounded by bomb splinters when the house of two of the victims was destroyed.

CARDINAL AGAIN HELD UP.

BELFAST, June 18. Cardinal Logue, Primate of Ireland, and his co-adjutor, Archbishop O'Donnell, were again held up by Ulster Constabulary last night despite protests, and the baggage and documents carried in their motor cars were scrutinized, after which the prelates were allowed to proceed.

DEATH PENALTY FOR ARSON.

LONDON, June 18. The campaign of incendiarism in Belfast has become so alarming that the Northern Parliament is likely to impose the death penalty on persons setting fires, the Morning Post correspondent says.

NORTHLIFFE LIBELED.

LONDON, June 18. A libel action has been taken against Lord Northcliffe by some of his co-directors of the Associated Newspapers, Ltd., because Northcliffe expressed disapproval of some of the things which occurred while he was on his world tour.

CANTON CAPTURED.

PEKING, June 18. While the troops of General Chen Chung Ming had captured the city of Canton, capital of Southern China, Republic body guards of President Sun Yat Sen still fought from the Presidential palace, according to a despatch received here. Sen is believed to have escaped on a gunboat.

PRESIDENTIAL RESIDENCE CAPTURED.

AMOIY, China, June 18. The President's residence in Canton has been taken by the troops of General Chen Chung Min.

BALLOTS TO RAILWAYMEN.

CINCINNATI, June 18. Ballots on the question of striking against the reduction of railmen's wage will be sent to stationary firemen, oilers and signal men of the railways to-night.

TARIFF BILL WILL GO THROUGH.

WASHINGTON, June 18. President Harding on Saturday assured the Republican Senate leaders that the Tariff Bill would be held before the Senate until it passed.

THE MAJORITY'S REPLY.

CHICAGO, June 18. The majority members of the United States Railroad Labor Board who yesterday ordered \$27,000,000 slashed from the wages of railway workers today replied to criticisms of the minority members with the charge that the

latter presented "incendiary arguments in strained and exaggerated efforts to induce the employees to strike." The minority members were accused of "sowing tiny seeds that have blossomed into industrial anarchy in Russia."

LABOUR LEADERS TO CONFER TOMORROW.

CINCINNATI, June 18. The chiefs of the miners and rail unions have agreed to hold a conference on Tuesday to discuss joint action against wage reductions.

Our Dumb Animals.

Report of the Chief Agent of the S.P.A. for week ending 17th June. Called at Victoria Street in response to a phone message Sunday morning and humanely destroyed a cat, the owner giving me a subscription to the Society's funds. Ordered off the street four lame horses for treatment. Supervised and examined twenty-five head of cattle ex. S.S. Sable I. Found cattle were in good condition on landing. Also looked after 45 head cattle ex. railway, found they were not removed from the pens to 6 p.m. and said cattle were not watered during that period and warned importers. Interviewed railway authorities who are making arrangements to have a water pipe installed to water all future shipments of cattle promptly on arrival in the same way as Messrs. Harvey & Co. and Furness Witty Co. promptly water cattle shipments on their premises. Also was phoned from Reading Road to destroy a collie dog accidentally run over by a motor. Went to Whitbourne on Wednesday to investigate ill-treatment and starvation of a stallion formerly owned by the Agricultural Dept., now owned by a man named Sparks. Found horse had broken ribs and the animal had already been destroyed by Mr. Sinnott, telegraph operator, a great friend of the dumb animals and of the S.P.A. The Society also was appealed to by residents of Circular Road in reference to a cow and new born calf left out in the pasture in Rennie's field on the night of Wednesday. Society had the cow and calf removed to a stable and delivered same to owner next day, he paying expenses.
