Particulars of the Collision.

London, Dec. 1 .- The ship Trim at an early hour this morning, bringing pointed as one of the hospital orderlies the intelligence of a dreadful disaster to the steamship Ville de Havre, under command of Captain Surmount, at two o'clock on the morning of the 23rd of o'clock on the morning of the 23rd of November.
