The King has succeeded in England in preventing the opposition from asking questions in Parliament concerning the allegations of sordid misconduct among the Dublin Castle officials, but in Ireland he as not succeeded in choking off public opinion. Why Dublin is Angry.

What enrages Dublin is that the investigation of these charges has been stifled, while Lord Aberdeen has aroused the anger of the Irish by his extreme Puritanical measures. He attends the race meetings under protest, forbids card-playing and recently ordered that young couples should not "sit out" the dances in dark corners during state balls. Yet he does not insist on purging Dublin Castle.

This condition of affairs has resulted in the wholesale boycotting of all the vice-regal entertainments by the Irish aristocracy, and in order to break this boycott the King has ordered that no Irish debutantes shall be presented at Buckingham Palace unless they first attend the Dublin viceregal court. By this measure the King hopes to prevent a repetition of the DO CANADIANS conditions at the last Dublin levees and drawing-rooms, when practically no one attended.
