Philippopolls, Eastern Rumelia, Oct. 6 .-- The official announcement of the independence of Bulgaria made at Tirnovo yesterday by Prince Ferdinand has been enthusiastically received in this city, the capital of Eastern Rumelia. Today the church bells are ringing and large crowds, headed by bands, are parading the streets and nolding peaceful demonstrations in front of the various consulates. "Emperor" Ferdinand is expected to arrive here shortly.

London, Oct. 6.-The Bulgarian charge d'affaires, M. De Breff, today officially informed Great Britain of Bulgaria's declaration of independence. The Bulgarian Government instructed its representative to say also that in proclaiming her independence Bulgaria had no desire for war, and that her aims were eminently peace-

ful. All the Bulgarian diplomatic representatives abroad are taking similar

action.
