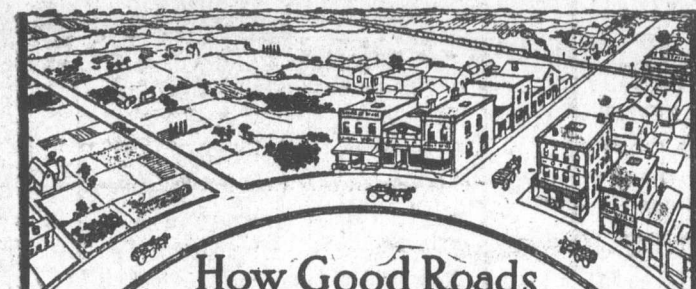

How the Milkmaids of Holland Carry Heavy Loads.

ADVANTAGES OF A YOKE.

Two Pails Are More Easily Borne Than One When Balanced on the Shoulders. Things of Interest to Little People. Puzzles and Games.

To carry two pails of milk or water is easier than to carry one if you know how and have a yoke such as the girl in the picture has balanced on her shoulder. Every boy who has ever carried water from the well in a bucket knows it is a pretty hard job.

and he usually sticks one arm out to help balance the loaded side. When he has two buckets the job is easier, if they are not too heavy. The weight of one offsets that of the other, and he is able to walk erect, but finds it difficult to prevent the pails knocking against his legs. The girl in the picture is a milkmaid and she lives in Holland, or the Netherlands, which is a famous dairy country. You notice that she has a wooden yoke placed at the back of her neck and resting on her shoulders. On each end of the yoke she suspends two great pails of milk and is able to carry them with ease. The weight is balanced on the shoulders, which she relieves somewhat with her hands. But one of the pails is shown, space not permitting the other to appear in the picture. Those who have to carry water any distance might use this scheme to lighten themselves.

A Natural Sundial.

There is no need for clocks on the Aegean sea whenever the sun is shining. There nature has arranged her only timepiece, one that does not vary with the passing centuries. This natural time marker is the largest sun dial in the world. Projecting into the blue waters of the sea is a large promontory which lifts its head 3,000 feet above the waves. As the sun swings round the pointed shadow of the mountain just touches one after the other a number of small islands, which are at exact distances apart, and act as hour marks on the great dial.
