One of the most successful hog raisers on a small scale is one who never gave up his secret as follows:

As soon as you begin to feed the pig in the pen, say eight or ten weeks old, see at first, by trial, just how much the pig can eat and digest, and always after that feed regularly just that quantity and no more.

Do not let the pig grow larger, for if that should be the case the digestive function of the pig would be disturbed, and he would be inclined to become fat.

When the pig is full grown, and the fattening commences, he begins gradually to increase the feed, but never giving more than the animal can freely and daily increase the allowance until the hog has all he can digest properly.
