Master and Servant—Workmen's Compensation for Injuries Act—Negligence—Defective Ways—Unguarded Circular Saw—Conflict of Evidence.]—Action by the plaintiff for damages for injuries received by coming into contact with a circular saw while engaged in defendant's employment, whereby he lost the use of his left hand and arm, which injuries he alleged were caused by defendant's negligence. The learned Chief Justice held that the plaintiff had entirely failed to establish every material fact which it is necessary for him to prove in order to succeed.
