A Message was received from the Senate, agreeing to the following Bills, *without amendment, viz.:*—

Bill No. 66 to extend the Act establishing one uniform Currency for the Dominion of Canada, to the Provinces of British Columbia and Prince Edward Island.

Bill No. 7 to incorporate "The Wrecking and Salvage Company of Canada."

Bill No. 34 to incorporate "The Dominion Salvage and Wrecking Company of Canada;"—and

Bill No. 54 to amend the Act of incorporation of "The Accident Insurance Company of Canada," and to authorize the change of name of the said Company to "The Accident Insurance Company of North-America."

Also,—with the following Bill No. 87 of their own, intituled: "An Act respecting Naturalization and Aliens," to which the concurrence of this House was desired.— (On motion of Mr. *Langevin*, the said Bill was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading, *to-morrow*).

Mr. *Girouard* (Jacques Cartier) moved, that the Bill No. 51 to limit the appellate jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Canada, be now read a second time.

And a Debate arising thereon ;

Sir *John A. Macdonald* moved, that the Debate be adjourned.

And The House having continued to sit after 12 of the clock, midnight;

THURSDAY, 10th MARCH, 1881.

The motion was then agreed to, and the Debate on the said Bill, adjourned accordingly.

The House then adjourned at 5 minutes past 12 o'clock A.M.
