vii.

School; and that it shall be the duty of the Secretary, at the meeting in the month of November in each and every year, to make a return of those who have not paid up the 25s. for the year ending the 30th day of April previous, and that he shall propose that such names be erased from the list of Incorporated Members.

IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of Toronto for the time being, of the members appointed by the Charter, and of so many of the other Associated Members of the Society as shall be elected by ballot members of the Corporation, at the meetings to be from time to time holden on the days and at the place appointed by the By-laws of the Corporation for its stated meetings: Provided always, that the whole number of members of the said Corporation, in addition to those who are made members by the Statute, shall at no time exceed three hundred, and that the whole number of members of the Corporation shall never be less than one hundred.

V.

That the Standing Committee of the Society, to be appointed as provided in one of the following By-laws, be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation, without reference to the limitation of numbers.

VI.

That the Lord Bishop of Toronto for the time being shall be President of the Society, and the Venerable the Archdeacons within the Diocese shall be Vice-Presidents.

VII.

That the Society shall hold a General Meeting on the second Tuesday in June in each year, when they shall choose one or more Vice-President or Vice-Presidents, in addition to the Archdeacons; one or more Secretary or Secretaries; one or more Auditor or Auditors, and such other officers or servants as shall be thought convenient, for the year ensuing: Provided always, that no person not a member of the Society shall be eligible to any office in the same.

VIII.

That the paid officers to be appointed under the foregoing rule shall be the Secretary or Secretaries and the Auditor or Auditors, with such salaries as the Society may from time to time appoint; and the Secretary or Secretaries so paid shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Solicitor of the Society to the amount of £1,000. This sum is to be considered as the minimum amount to be given; but it is not to be taken as limiting the security to that amount, should it at any time be considered advisable to increase the same.

IX.

That the Standing Committee shall propose to the Board at the General Meeting in November a list of seven members of the Society, to form the Tract and Book Committee for the year ensuing: that at that meeting any member be at liberty to propose another list of seven members of the Society, instead of that proposed by the Standing Committee; and that the election of the Tract and Book Committee take place at the General Meeting in February.

X.

That if it shall happen that any of the persons at any time chosen into any of the said offices shall die, or on any account be removed from such office at any time during the period for which he was elected or appointed to serve, in such case the President, or any one of the Vice-Presidents, shall convene a meeting, to be held at
