EXTRACT FROM AN OPINION OF JAMES STEWART, ESQ.,
NOW SIR JAMES STEWART, BART. CHIEF JUSTICE
OF LOWER CANADA, ON VARIOUS POINTS RELATIVE
TO THE INQUIRY INSTITUTED BY MESSRS. DALY AND
VEZINA, RELATIVE TO THE CONDUCT OF MR. CHIS-
HOLME; DATED QUEBEC, 25TH JANUARY, 1837.

EXTRACT OF A LETTER FROM LORD SEATON TO A
FRIEND OF MR. CHISHOLME'S, IN ENGLAND, DATED
19TH NOVEMBER, 1841.

“The inclosure is from Mr. Chisholme, whose case I brought before Lord John Russell, with such observations as appeared to me would produce a favourable result. Lord John communicated my statement to Lord Sydenham, and, I believe, even suggested that the petitioner should be provided for.”
