To attempt to frighten men into morality has never proved successful.

Subject. To attempt to frighten men into morality (Noun Compound), Predicate, has, Object proved (infin.), Extensions 1, never, 2, successful. He seems to have done his duty faithfully. Subject, He, Predicate, seems, Extensions, 1, to have done his duty, 2, faithfully.

ANALYSIS OF COMPLEX SENTENCES.

The general analysis of a complex sentence consists in distinguishing the principal statement from Post Compounds and stating the relation between them. In general analysis, Post Compounds are treated as single words, nouns, adjectives or adverbs. A conjunction connecting a Post Compound with the principal statement is not considered an integral part of the clause which it introduces.

Example of General Analysis of a Complex Sentence: They said that he would be killed if he attempted that. Principal Statement, They said.

Post Compounds 1, (that) he would be killed 2, if he attem; ted that.

Detailed analysis of Complex sentences consists in adding to the above, the analysis of the prin. statement and Post Com. separately.

(1) In detailed represent the print statement by the capital A. 2, Represent all Post Com. directly dependent upon the print statement by a1, numbering them successfully 1a1,2a1 3a1, etc. (3) Represent all Post Com. leaning on a1, as 1a2, 2a2, 3a2 etc. Coatinue this process of notation as far as circumstances may require.
