July 18, 1781. "The extracts from my correspondence with Earl Cornwallis, which I have had the honour to transmit from time to time to your Lordship, will shew, that I left in Carolina a very fair proportion of my army, and such as his Lordship thought sufficient to secure South, and recover North Carolina. With what was left for me to act with in this quarter, I took the sield immediately upon my arrival here. General Lesse's expedition
