to their national peculiarities of taste and habit, (now, by the way, fast disappearing,) which are common to all nations, and to none more than ourselves, and which they themselves ridicule quite as much as strangers.

In conclusion, I must observe, that I met with nothing but civility and hospitality during my stay in America; and I cannot imagine that any one who has a year at his disposal, and two or three hundred pounds in his pocket, can spend them with more profit and enjoyment than in the United States.
