



BACTERIA THAT DO GOOD WORK

While bacteria bear, in the popular estimation, an evil reputation, by reason of the part they play in so many fatal diseases, not all the bacteria in the world are working against the hu-man race and its interest, says Har-per's Weekly. Indeed, some bacteria are man's potent and faithful allies. The minute organisms, for instance, that manufacture nitric acid as a food plant are of a most beneficient kind. One set of bacteria busy themselves in converting ammonia found in the soil into nitrous acid.

There their work ends, and, so far as the plants are concerned; it has been ineffective; since plants cannot feed upon nitrous acid. At this point, however, another set of bacteria come forward, and from the
