Hamilton Council Met Last Evening to Read Bylaws. Company Formed, Stock Subscribed for the New Fireproof Hotel.

A Description of the Hotel as It Will Appear When Finished - Modern in Every Sense of the Term - It Will Cost Between Two and Three Millions.

Mr. Aemilius Jarvis has recently returned from a trip to New York, where he has been successful in interesting capitalists in the new hotel to be erected in Toronto. The new fireproof hotel is to be built on King-street, between the eastern wall of Potter's optical store, and the western wall of Catto's dry goods store, having a frontage of 207 feet 10 1/2 inches on King-street, and a depth of 107 feet 7 1/2 inches to Colborne-street. The style of architecture is what is termed "free romantic."

Continued from Page 1. smallest notions of justice and equity must understand that those who in good faith have invested their capital in an industry sanctioned and protected by law are entitled to compensation when that industry and the property which it represents are suddenly abolished, not because those who are engaged in this industry have committed any fault which would justify the suppression of their industry, but through compulsory expropriation, made in the public interest.
