C. P. R. SHOWS STRENGTH.

Most Canadian Issues Were Dull Yesterday. Wall-Street List Advanced Early, Under the Leadership of Brooklyn R.T. and Metropolitan. Reaction—Close Was Irregular, With Net Gains in Some Stocks and Net Losses in Others for the Day.

Thursday Evening, April 13. Dullness for the most part characterized the Canadian stock market today. Trading in Canadian securities was, however, somewhat of a feature. This stock sold up to 87 1/2% on Montreal exchange and brought 8 1/2% at Montreal, where it closed at 8 1/2%.

Bank clearings at Toronto the past week with usual comparisons, were: Week ended April 13 \$9,821,563 \$1,210,938 Last week \$7,550,922 718,900 Cor. week 1918 \$1,220,642 701,520 On the Stock Exchange to-day local transportation and gas properties were advanced, and retained about half the rise to the end. Brooklyn Transit's strength was connected with its purchases of the King's County Elevated system. There were no new developments to account for the rise in Manhattan and Metropolitan. Assurance that adverse legislation was unlikely helped Consolidated Gas and Brooklyn Union Gas. Among other specialties that were strong were Sugar and Preserved Steel Car. The activity and strength of the specialties caused the early weakness in London to be ignored, and the standard railways were neglected until the afternoon, when renewed activity was at the expense of values. Some considered the Samson incident as a bear argument, but crop damage reports caused the Grangers to be sold freely. Important bull interests seemed to bid up their properties in the forenoon, but were not heavy buyers, judging by appearances. The reactionary movement in the railways cut down some of the advances in special issues, including the Toronto Gas. The selling movement was in progress at the end, leaving the market weak. Call money in the late dealings rose up to the legal figure, but later eased off to 4 per cent. The public was induced by the early advance in the specialties to take an increased interest in the market, which was reflected in the volume of commission house business. The more urgent demand of this character was satisfied before the final hour, when there was considerable professional realizing. Messrs. Henry Clews & Co., New York, wired Kerr & Morson at noon to-day as follows: "The market was strong this morning under the leadership of traction stocks. No important news." McIntyre & Wardwell say: Nothing of a serious character having developed in a political way to disturb relations with Germany, sentiment is moderately bullish again. London and Continental markets steady. The majority of commission houses are bullish, but there is a fair reactionist party among professional operators. There is, however, very little short interest left. It is said Brooklyn Rapid Transit will be put on a dividend basis of 2 per cent. per quarter.

Notes by Cable. Consols declined 1-16 in London to-day.

In London American rails to-day closed generally 1/4 to 3/4 lower than yesterday. In Paris 3 per cent. rates were at 10 1/2%.
