Problem of Good Living. PRICES OF MEAT GO UP.

"While the average housekeeper may be ignorant as to whether a beef trust has been formed or whether the increase in the price of meat is due to other causes, if she is a woman of moderate means she has become convinced that she must turn to something except animal food for the main fare of her family," says The Buffalo Express.
