

## LOCAL MARKET.

London, Wednesday, April 24.  
Very little hay or oats offered at the market today.  
For hay, \$13.50 to \$14.50 was paid; there were only 3 loads on the stand.  
Oats were in small supply, there being only 4 loads offered; sales were made at \$1.51 to \$1.53 per cwt.

## WEEKLY REVIEW.

The markets held here the past week were not as well attended as in the previous week. The reason assigned for the light attendance is that the farmers are busy preparing the ground for seed.  
There is a good demand in every line, and prices are firm.  
Grain—Oats are higher in price, at \$1.30 to \$1.35 per cwt—4.15c to 4.5c per bu; the supply of oats is exceedingly small, and there is practically nothing doing in barley or wheat, there being only an occasional load offered.  
Hay and Straw—Hay was a drug last week, but so far this week there have been only about a dozen loads offered; sales are a consequence are brisk and prices are higher, from \$13 to \$14 per ton. There are not many loads of straw offering, and prices are steady at \$5 per ton.  
Butter and Eggs—Butter is in good demand, at 25c for crocks and 26c for pound rolls; occasionally 27c is paid for a nice basket of rolls; the dealers say that the price of butter is at high water mark for this season. Eggs are in good demand and prices are firm at 15c to 15 1/2c per dozen wholesale; most of the sales are made at the highest figure.

Apples—While the supply is light, there is not a very brisk demand; prices are a trifle higher for dealers, from \$10 to \$11 per bag and \$1.75 to \$2.50 per barrel.  
Potatoes—Sales are fairly brisk, at 80c to 90c per bag; there should be a good demand for seed potatoes during the next two or three weeks.  
Poultry—As usual at this time of the year, there is very little offering; last year's fowls are being sold at 10c to 11c per lb alive, or 15c to 16c dressed; turkeys sell at 12c per lb alive and 15c to 16c dressed.  
Dressed Hogs—Owing to the cool weather the demand is brisker than usual at this season; prices range from \$8.75 to \$9 per cwt for light hogs.  
Live Hogs—The price for Monday's shipment will be \$8.25 to \$8.50 per cwt higher than last week for select; small pigs are selling at \$5.50 to \$7 per pair.  
Butcher's Meats—Beef is firmer, at \$5.50 to \$7.50 per cwt; veal is dull, the market being over-supplied; sales are made at \$5 to \$6 per cwt; mutton is selling at \$7 to \$10 per cwt, the latter price for light stuff; spring lambs sell at \$5.50 to \$6.50 each; yearlings, 12c to 15c per lb.  
Maple Syrup—Sales are a trifle slow, at \$1.15 to \$1.25 per gallon.  
There is no change in the prices of hides and tallow.
