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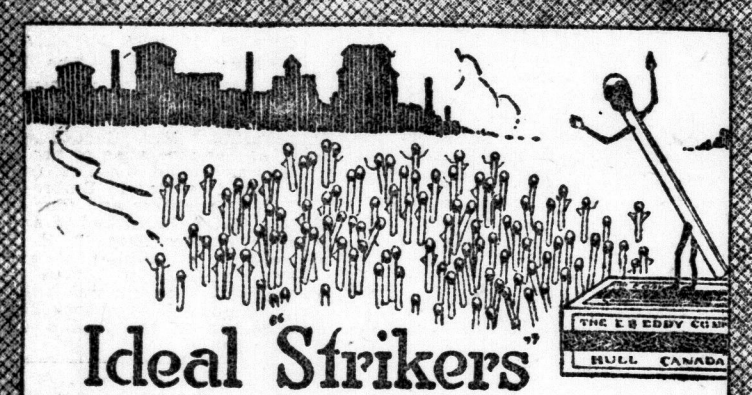

GODFREY SAYS MORRISON GAVE POLITICAL TALK

Uses Report of U. F. O. Secretary's Speech to Guelph Students.

EARLY CLOSING STORES

Rollo Defends Bylaws To Shut Shops Early, Opposes Curry Bill.

TORONTO, April 9.—F. G. Sandy's bill to prohibit transportation of liquor within Ontario, which was introduced in the Legislature by the member for South Victoria yesterday and objected to by Hon. G. Howard Ferguson on the ground that it was not in order for a private member to introduce a bill affecting the revenues of the province, was given its first reading today, the Speaker, Hon. Nelson Parliament, having overruled Mr. Ferguson's objection.

Dr. Forbes Godfrey drew the attention of the House to a report of a speech made at Guelph by J. J. Morrison, secretary of the United Farmers of Ontario. Mr. Morrison was quoted as saying that Premier Drury had introduced a bill to close the Legislature at 6 o'clock, and that a majority in the House, and hence could not introduce all the legislation he desired.

"I would ask the minister of agriculture," observed Dr. Godfrey, "whether this quasi-political sermonette delivered by Mr. Morrison in such a strictly non-partisan institution as the Guelph Agricultural College, has its indignation."

Dr. Godfrey said he believed that Mr. Morrison never delivered a speech which would have any political significance in the Guelph College. Mr. Doherty replied: "He was there to deliver an address on political economy."

Do you deny that this is a partisan speech?" demanded Dr. Godfrey.

"I have answered the honorable gentleman very fully," replied the minister of agriculture.

"If this newspaper report is correct, do you approve of it?" Dr. Godfrey asked.

"I consider the question frivolous," declared Mr. Doherty. "If I had anything to do with the newspaper in question, I might be prepared to answer more fully, in answer to a question by J. A. Pinard, East Ottawa, stated that the cost of advertising in the Guelph Agricultural College, has been increased by the provincial health department in connection with vaccination."

Owen Sound has aspirations to cityhood and before the present sitting of the Ontario Legislature is over it will probably have its ambition realized.

Mr. D. J. Taylor, North Grey, introduced for the first reading a bill to incorporate the Georgian Bay town as a city.

There is little likelihood of any opposition to the proposed measure.

Mr. J. W. Curry, K.C., Southeast Toronto, introduced a bill to incorporate the Ontario Police Association.

Asked for an explanation of the document, Curry said that it enabled the police to have an association of their own, as recommended in the findings of the commission.

The introduction for the second reading of Hon. Mr. Nixon's housing act found the Government and Opposition leader in accord that there should be some limit to the borrowing power of municipal councils.

Upon the suggestion of Premier Drury, however, the bill was given a second reading and will be amended, if necessary, in committee.

In introducing the measure Hon. Mr. Nixon explained that it was a duplicate of the present measure, except that it provided for the direct government loans. Major Pointe said he thought the bill would be amended to be consulted. The whole matter should not be left to the discretion of a Government official.

MacBride for Aid.

Mr. M. MacBride, Brantford, put the housing situation strongly before the House, and pointed out that if huge debentures were to be submitted to taxpayers they would be before since ratepayers in the main were landless.

Hon. Mr. Ferguson favored the bill as it stood.

Hon. Mr. J. W. Curry, K.C., Southeast Toronto, stood alone in support of a bill which he introduced to amend the Housing Act.

The bill permitted the bill to go on to the municipal committee. It was opposed from the Liberal benches by Mr. Curry's leader, Mr. Stewart. Its chances of getting through committee appear to be not too bright.

Hon. Walter Hullo pointed out that it was a serious thing to legislate to take away something for which workers had fought for years. He said the early closing bill was a measure in the interest of the retail clerk, and it should not be taken away from them.
