Elections for office resulted as follows: Honorary president, Sir F. W. Borden; president, Col. Sam. Hughes, M.P.; vice-presidents—Ontario, Lieut.-Col. W. C. MacDonald, R.O.; Quebec, Lieut.-Col. E. B. Ibbotson; Nova Scotia, senator Power; New Brunswick, Col. John Tilson; Manitoba, Hon. Hugh John Macdonald; Alberta, Col. E. G. Prior; Prince Edward Island, Lieut.-Col. J. A. Longworth; Lord Strathcona, general W. D. Otter; Col. J. D. Irving, Halifax; secretary, Major C. F. Winter; treasurer, Major E. D. Sutherland. The council was re-elected.

WON'T DISMISS KELSEY.

OBITUARY.

The death of Charles Cavers of 235 Sherbourne street occurred during Tuesday night. Mr. Cavers, who had lived in Toronto for twenty years, was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, eighty-one years ago.

Saskatchewan Lands.

OTTAWA, Feb. 26.—At the agricultural committee to-day, Prof. McInnes of the Geological Survey was heard in regard to the possibilities of the unsettled land on the Saskatchewan and the Nelson Rivers, on the Carrot River, he said, there were 3,000,000 acres of land which required draining to make it fit for cultivation.

Found Weapons on Italians.

MONTREAL, Feb. 26.—Provincial Chief McCaskey arrested eight Italians on the street to-day on suspicion of carrying concealed weapons, and found three revolvers, six stiletos and seven razors.

Snowbound.


