

Washington, Dec. 3. — (Canadian Press.) — The cost of running the United States Government for the fiscal year 1926 was estimated at \$3,729,-

year 1926 was estimated at \$3,729,-519,846.48, an estimated reduction of \$59,225,931.72 from the expenditures of the current fiscal year, in the annual budget sent to Congress by President Coolidge yesterday. In a special message transmitted to both Houses of Congress, the Presi-dent advised against any further re-duction in taxes. He estimated a sur-plus in revonue over expenditures for the present fiscal year of \$67,884,489, and estimated the surplus for the fiscal year 1926 at \$373,748,714. No further cuts should be made in the tax schedcuts should be made in the tax sched-ules, the President said, until definite results from the present tax laws are know-

London, Dec. 3—London has its own "bobbed hair bandit," according to police reports. These describe the woman as about 23 years old, a blonde with bobbed hair, and say she is working in conjunction with a man, allegedly her husband, and another woman.
