Quebec, June 8—About forty fishing schooners were lost with a loss of life nbering about twenty, in a disaster caused last Friday night by a severe form that swept the coast of northern New Brunswick and Bay Chaleur.

Mostly all the wrecked boats were driven ashore on Miscou and Shippeg Islands, and these points being rather remote, news of the disaster was slow in coming in. Twenty fishermen are reported drowned and of these the bod-
