GIRL OF 6 GIVES UP CRIME

TRADE COMMENT

British and American Commerce is Recovering from Lowest Levels—Import and Export Figures for August Indicate Situation is Improving.

(New York Evening Post)

Increases of \$54,000,000 in exports, and of \$13,000,000 in imports during August, tend to confirm the impression that the low levels reached during July may be the lowest of the foreign depression.

Although no great revival is anticipated in this field, and although foreign sales will follow in the natural course of events, confidence is increasing, and a basis seems finally to have been established for the slow expansion of American business abroad.

Shipments of agricultural products were undoubtedly an important factor in the heavy export total for August. Weekly market reports throughout the month were greater than during July, and in the week ended September 12, 1921, the total was \$12,000,000.

Cotton shipments, however, represented a decline from the previous month, and it will be surprising if the improvement is not also reflected in greater shipments of manufactured products. The situation is fundamentally encouraging and certain to be reflected in foreign sales in the value of total shipments for the month of August.
