have it in their power to improve the reduced income of the Institution; and further, with regard to the question of Legislative aid, that the Synod confide to the Board of Trustees the interests of the Institution involved in such a settlement of this question as will satisfy the just expectations of the members of this Court and their fellow-Christians throughout the land, and at the same time preserve due respect for those principles to which, in establishing a College at great expense and in maintaining it for more than a quarter of a century, they have adhered; urgently solicit the alumni and graduates of the University and the members of this Synod and of the Church at large to co-operate zealously with the Trustees, as opportunity may offer; and appoint a Committee, consisting of Messrs. Dobie, D. J. Macdonnell; Dennistoun, Logie, and Senator Donald Macdonald, with power to present in name and by authority of this Court a respectful Memorial to the Government, setting forth the claims of the Institution and the hardship and injustice that would be inflicted by the withdrawal of public aid.

The Synod adjourned to meet in this place on Monday morning at a quarter before eleven o'clock, of which public intimation was made, and this Diet was closed with prayer.

SUPPLY OF RELIGIOUS ORDINANCES TO LUMBERMEN.

Mr. William Bain gave in a report from the Presbytery of Perth, which Presbytery the Synod at last meeting had instructed to consider the means best calculated to provide for the spiritual wants of the Lumbermen, stating that they had given attention to the important matter intrusted to them, and that Messrs. James B. Mullan and
