As Local Preachers, stand by the cross of a crucified and risen Christ, making Him your glory and your theme: as Leaders, diligently watch the flock of God entrusted to your care: as Stewards, deal bountifully with them who come to you in the stead of God: as Members, be true to the cause, and regular at the means of grace: as Christians, be upright among men, burning and shining lights in the world, sanctified wholly in heart and life, and, pressing on, arrive at length upon the heavenly mountain top, and in those broad and beautiful uplands dwell when the day of eternity dawns, and the shadows of this life flee away.
