FIRST EDITION. THE YOUNG MEMORIAL. Handed over to the City To-Day. MAYOR PETERS ACCEPTS. IN THE PRESENCE OF A GREAT CONCOURSE OF PEOPLE.

The Oration by Rev. George Brown—Other Addresses—Songs by the School of the Sacred Heart—An Impressive Scene.

A clear sky and brilliant sunshine made yesterday a typical fall day. Those who remember Oct. 30, 1890, will readily call to mind that it was cold and that a strong wind prevailed. The connection between the two days lies in the fact that on this day a year ago Fred Young lost his life trying to save that of fellow creature; and that to day the monument by the school children and between 2000 and 3000 people was formally handed over to the city of St. John by the contractor. Hundreds saw the sad death of the lad Young—few he was not 19 years of age—economically the government is today by which the monument to his heroism and self-sacrifice became the property of the city of St. John; the gift of the people to the corporation in celebration of one heroic act.

The space around the monument was roped off during the morning by the salvage corps and the two temporary stands were occupied by the school children and the other by the Fusilliers band draped with the National Flag. It was a brilliant spectacle, and an impressive one also. Officers of the local militia in their brilliant uniforms and ladies and gentlemen who had been drawn thither to honor to a dead hero, though exactly more than a boy in years, this with the music of the band and the singing of the children made a scene which few of the witnesses will forget.

Such a crowd has not been seen on the King square for years that which gathered there this afternoon. As early as 1:30 every available inch of space near the square was taken up, and when the common crowd and invited guests came the square was black with people of both sexes and all ages.
