

THE EIGHTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in British North America, was field in the Newsate-Street Chapel, on Tuesday Evening, October 7th, 1833.

DR. ROLPH was unanimously called to the Chair.

The Meeting was opened with singing and prayer by the Rev. George Marsden, (Representative of the British Conference.)

The Chairman having stated the object of the Meeting, the Secretary read his Report, when the following Resolutions were severally put and carried:—

Moved by the Rev. James Richardson, seconded by the Rev. John Ryerson,—

That the Report just read be adopted, and printed under the direction of the Board of Managers.

Moved by the Rev. William Case, seconded by the Rev. Peter Jones, (Indian Missionary,)—

That this Society has still cause of gratitude to Almighty God for the success which has attended its efforts, and the labours of the Missionaries to civilize the aborigines of Upper Canada, and dispense to them the word of life.

Moved by the Rev. George Marsden, seconded by the Rev. Joseph Stinson, (Representative of the Wesleyan Missionary Committee,)—

That this Society cannot but rejoice in the success which, through the Divine Blessing, is attending Missionary exertions throughout the world.
