used to inoculate healthy animals, will reproduce the disease as effectively as the saliva. Again, one of the great difficulties in research on rabies arises rom the uncertainty of the evil after oculation or a bite, and the long time of incubation. M. Pasteur is now able to communicate the disease surely, and to shorten considerably the time of incubation. His method is to inoculate directly the surface of the brain, having recourse to trepanation, and using as noculating matter the celebral substance of a mad dog as pure as possible. In that case the first symptoms of rabies infallibly appear in a week or two, and death ensues in less than three weeks. The results of Pasteur's further investigations will be awaited with unusual interest, in the hope that they may lead to the pointing out of some means of alleviating the sufferings of humanity from this terrible disease, of the nature of which so little is thus far known.
