**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.**  
Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, who has resided in Canada for one year, may homestead a quarter section of available land in certain districts. The applicant must appear in person at the District Office or Sub-agency for the district. Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the homesteader. The homesteader must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn money and pay the balance of the price). A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate five acres and erect a house worth \$100.
