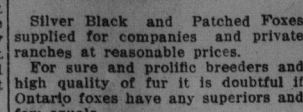


PRODUCE PRICES IN CANADIAN CENTRES

Export situation an important factor in forcing down prices — Sentiment more optimistic in some quarters.

Chicago, Aug. 15.—Wheat prices have tended steadily downward during the past week with the export situation the essential factor in making the market move. The uncertainty surrounding the ability of exporters to get their wheat to the United Kingdom, or to Europe, has induced selling and some wheat previously bought for export has been sold. Sentiment in some quarters was more optimistic toward the close of the week, but the market continued its downward course. The meeting held Friday at Washington between Secretary McAdoo and leading bankers, foreign exchange men and grain exporters was awaited with great interest. Exporters generally are considerably in the dark regarding the export situation although Liverpool grain interests appear more optimistic of the future. The fact that a few cargoes of wheat left the United States during the week was regarded as portending a more favorable export situation. Crop from the northwest received a boost in price as a result of the news. Corn prices have declined along with wheat and also because of the fall of needed rains in the State of Kansas. The market has been somewhat depressed by cash selling. The market has been heavy.

Oats were weaker, but showed greater improvement of response to the news of corn. — *Journal of Commerce.*
