Rev. G. A, Kuhring, rector of St. John's (Stone) church, who had been at the front for the past two years, and who arrived home yesterday, presided at the meeting in that church, and was given a hearty welcome by the members present.

After the election of officers there was a discussion on a proposed movement of the Diocesan Synod to deprive self-supporting parishes in this diocese the right of selecting their own rector.
