Courses of Instruction.

Courses of Study for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts.

The subjects of the Undergraduate Course form a system of prescribed and elective study. The subjects of the first two years have been selected mainly for their disciplinary value, and with the exception that a choice is offered between Greek and French, are strictly prescribed. In the last two years the element of personal choice is more freely introduced, the prescribed studies occupying in the Junior year seven of the sixteen hours of instruction each week, and in the Senior year four of the thirteen hours.

In addition to the regular class instruction, Honor courses have been arranged for the advantage of students who may be able to do more than the ordinary assignments of their classes. These are open at the beginning of the Junior year to those undergraduates who have made during the first two years an average of not less than seventy-five per cent of the available marks. The course of study selected must be continued during the Junior and Senior years, when the successful student will be graduated with Honors in the department chosen.

Any student failing to complete the work required for graduation with Honors shall be entitled to receive from the Professor of the Department a certificate for the part of the course successfully accomplished, provided he shall have continued the study during at least one year.

Any undergraduate, having not lower than second-class standing, may, by vote of the Faculty, be permitted to give special attention to a particular study, and in case his attainments justify it, he may receive a certificate from the Professor of the Department.
