KILLAM, AMASA EMERSON, J.P. (Westmoreland.)

Great-grandf., on father's side, was an officer in the British Army. Served during the American Revolution, and upon the U.S. securing their independence, came to N.B. and settled in Sackville. Grand parents, on mother's side, were also U.E. Loyalists. B. 25 Aug., 1834. Ed. at Common Sch. M., 25 July, 1857, at Sackville, Millicent Wheaton.
