

CAMERON, *Hon. MATTHEW CROOKS, Q. C.* [*Toronto East.*]

S. of the late John M. A. Cameron, Esq., who held a responsible position in the Canada Company's Office in Toronto for a lengthened period.

B. Ed. at U. C. College. Called to the Bar U. C., Hilary Term, 1849. Created Q. C., 1863. Is head of the law firm of Cameron and McMichael, and occupies a distinguished position as a Criminal lawyer. Is a director of the Dominion Telegraph Co. Has been President of the Ontario Literary Society. Appointed Provl. Sec. and Registrar of Ontario under the new Constitution, July, 1867. Sat for North Ontario in L. A., Can., from g. e. 1861 to 1863, when he was defeated, and for same seat from July 1864 until the Union, when he was a second time defeated. Has been an Alderman of Toronto. Contested the Mayoralty of that city unsuccessfully, 1861. Returned for present seat at last g. e. Pop. 19,991. No. of voters, 4,294.—*Jarvis St., Toronto.*
